Mongolian Red Cross Society conducted second review of the Organizational Capacity Assessment and Certification /OCAC/, self-assessment tool developed by International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. The capacity of our National Society was strengthened over the past 2 years and mid-level branches are illustrating active and creative performance. More members, youth and volunteers have joined the Mongolian Red Cross Society.

The Mongolian Red Cross Youth Movement is not only active nationally but also regionally. Every year they are organizing East Asia Regional Youth Camp Gathering addressing critical issues such as "Climate change" and "Comprehensive School Safety".

Over the years, Mongolian Red Cross Society has developed into not only participating but also organizing, initiating National Society of the Asia Pacific region.

We organized our biannual Partnership meeting and determined our cooperation plan for 2019-2020.

Mongolian Red Cross Society was selected as the coordinator of the Network of Volunteering organizations of Mongolia and organized various activities.

We increased the quality and accessibility of our community based public health promotion program and prepared training of trainers of first aid, using simulation based learning methods. We are acquiring new skills and experience by implementing violence prevention program.

Mid-level branches of MRCS, are strengthening their capacity to provide community based social care services, by enhancing cooperation with Social care service organizations at all levels.

In 2018, we reached 517000 people through our activities. We sincerely thank individuals, organizations, donors, members, volunteers and our partners who contributed and supported greatly.

The upcoming 2019 will be a year full of significant events and achievements to Mongolian Red Cross Society.

2019 marks the 80th anniversary of MRCS and 100th anniversary of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. On the occasion, we will have the opportunity to look back to the progress of our National Society over the past 80 years and will look into the future by developing our Strategy 2030.

**PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE OF
1.6 BILLION MNT TO 5500 HERDER HOUSEHOLDS OF
15 PROVINCES DURING THE WINTER OF 2017-2018.**

In cooperation with British Red Cross and Climate center, assisted 2000 herder households of 12 provinces with unconditional cash grant and animal care kit, in advance to extreme winter through "Forecast based Financing" program. / Cash and animal care kit equivalent to

355,000 MNT per household, in total **710,000,000** MNT/

With support from the Disaster Response Emergency Fund of International federation on Red cross and Red Crescent societies, assisted 1500 herder households of Arkhangai, Tuv and Uvs province with

cash grant and 1000 households of Bayankhongor, Dornogobi, Umnugobi, Darkhan-Uul province with food parcel and animal care kit.

In cooperation with World animal protection, assisted 1000 households of 20 soums of 4 provinces /Uvs, Zavkhan, Bayankhongor, Uvurkhangai/ affected by harsh spring conditions with animal care kit.

In total, MRCS assisted 5500 herder households of 15 provinces with cash, food parcel, hay and animal care kit worth of 1.6 billion MNT.

The area that we live is very prone to harsh winter conditions. Every year many households lose many livestock, which leads them to lose their livelihood. This year, we've received assistance before the winter condition worsened. We were able to give the animal care kit early and buy food for ourselves before snow blocks the road. The animal care kit that MRCS gave us was very nutritional, it's helping our livestock to stay healthy and survive the winter. The livestock seem to be very healthy this year. Now it's our duty to keep our livestock healthy during the winter.



I. BAATAR, herder of 6th bagh of Darkhan-Uul province

I've been herding for more than 20 years. This is the first time I'm receiving assistance from the Red Cross and I'm very happy. I heard about Red Cross assistance before, but didn't think they would help me. But one day I received call and they asked me to come receive my assistance. This was very timely assistance for us and I'm very happy that they're helping many people in our community. Thank you Mongolian Red Cross Society, for helping us during this harsh time.

J. AINAGULI, 54 years old, citizen of 3rd bagh, Ulgii soum, Bayan-Ulgii province.

My family has been living in Ulgii soum for about 20 years. During this time we faced many difficulties. But this year it was particularly hard for us. We lost our home to sudden flooding. Many households of my community lost their home to this flood. We've been living at this shelter camp for about 2-3 months. There is still shortage of drinking water. We are buying water from the well. It is difficult for us to buy water. We lost all of our belongings to flood. MRCS assisted us with household items. Now we are at least able to cook and eat here. My brother also received cash assistance from MRCS. All of us are trying to overcome this disaster together.





**THE RESILIENCE OF HERDERS
HAS INCREASED.**

Through “Community based disaster risk reduction” project, funded by the Australian Red Cross, 7 Branch disaster response teams, 10 community based firefighting teams were trained. Humanitarian classrooms at 14 schools were established and 14 herder groups were provided with 14 livestock winter shelter.

Through “Silent emergencies” project funded by British Red Cross, 18 livestock winter shelter for 18 herder groups of Dundgobi, Uvurkhangai and Bulgan provinces was built and reconstructed.

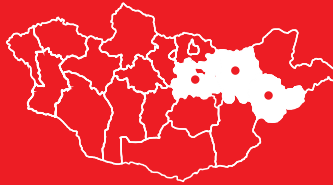




**PARTICIPATED IN DISASTER

DISASTER RISK REDUCTION.**

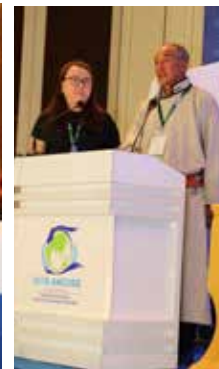

Prior to the AMCDRR, Mongolian Red Cross Society organized Pre-AMCDRR meeting for the Red Cross delegates at the Youth training center of MRCS. Participants discussed about regional cooperation on reducing disaster risk reduction.

The focus of the world is shifting to increase resilience of livelihood, health, economy and development. The global actors are starting to emphasize the importance of scientific evidence based innovative approaches, to reduce disaster risk. This was one of the main topics of the Asian ministerial conference on disaster risk reduction. The Red Cross and Red Crescent National Societies have shared our experience on early actions and disaster response. Increasing cooperation on disaster resilient infrastructure was also discussed during the conference. 40 Red Cross Red Crescent National Societies set our commitments under four areas. We call upon governments and stakeholders to increase investment in local systems and people to strengthen awareness and understanding of changing climate, disaster, social and health related risk.

MRCSS mobilized 250 trained volunteers for the Asian Ministerial conference for disaster risk reduction. The Government of Mongolia also awarded certificate of appreciation to the 250 volunteers at the Government Palace.

900 VOLUNTEERS TRAINED.

In cooperation with the National emergency management agency, 135 volunteers of 9 districts were trained on "Volunteering in emergencies". Within 2 years, MRCSS trained 900 volunteers of 21 provinces and 9 districts on responding to emergencies.

LAUNCH OF "VOLUNTEER ON WHEELS" PROGRAM.

MRCSS joined "Volunteer on wheels" program, being co-implemented by the IFRC and Red Cross Society of China. The hand-over ceremony for 150 bicycles was organized in Erlian, People's Republic of China. During the "Car free day of 2018", 150 volunteers participated in a bicycle parade.

The Youth Movement of MRCSS, in cooperation with "Sky Resort" ski resort, organized "Fresh air - remedy" event for 600 vulnerable children of 6 districts of Ulaanbaatar city and 400 children of orphanage care center.





6874 PEOPLE DONATED BLOOD.

MRCS organized monthly campaigns, events at national and local level to expand the number of voluntary and non-remunerated blood donors and increase the blood bank storage. 35111 were reached through blood donation campaigns and trainings organized by MRCS. In 2018, 6875 people donated blood through Red Cross events and 180 blood donors received 'honorary donor' award of MRCS.

MRCS, the Transportation center of Ulaanbaatar city and "Ulaanbaatar smart card" LLC signed MoU to provide free public transportation pass for honorary blood donors. MRCS is working in charge of registering and providing free public transportation pass card for honorary blood donors. In 2018, 218 honorary blood donors received free public transportation pass card.





**524 PEOPLE WERE SCREENED BY
TUBERCULOSIS ACTIVE SCREENING.**

“Detection and treatment of Tuberculosis among homeless people of Ulaanbaatar city” project was implemented with the support of Global Fund and Ministry of Health. In 2018, 1526 people were screened by 16 times of examination, 82 sputum test was conducted, 26 TB cases were detected and provided treatment.

**CHILDREN WITH CONGENITAL
HEART DISEASE RECEIVED FREE
CORRECTIVE SURGERY.**

The 2nd phase of “Angel’s journey in Mongolia – Providing surgical treatment to children with congenital heart disease” project was successfully implemented in cooperation with the Red Cross Society of China, Chinese Red Cross Foundation and Shastin Third Central hospital of Mongolia. Through the project, 46 children of target group successfully received free corrective surgery at the “Anjen” hospital in Beijing and National hospital in Khukhot city.

For the last few years, my daughter visited every hospitals and doctors that are ranked as “good”. But, all of them said that there is no way to treat, but we should find a heart donor. Last year, we visited doctors from India during their stay in Mongolia and they said that there is no need to have a donor; it is possible to correct it with a surgery. Then, we heard about the project being implement by MRCS and RCSC and came for the examination. We were very happy after hearing about the possibility of surgical treatment. “Mommy, I will sleep one night and wake up. Then I will be healthy.” this one sentence from my daughter encouraged me to take this journey. With the help of very skilled doctors and good-hearted people, we came back home all recovered. My son is 8 months old. He was diagnosed with congenital heart disease. Then, he was involved in the project to go to China for surgery and successfully received the surgery. When he was in Mongolia, he was under the regular examination of hospital. Now, his posture is much better. The environment of the hospital in Beijing as well as the behavior of the doctors were very good. Doctors regularly came to us to ask about our child’s well-being. We are thankful for all staffs of MRCS, RCSC and 3rd Central hospital in Mongolia. I think that providing free surgery and giving a life to someone is great deed to not only for my family but also to the country as well.

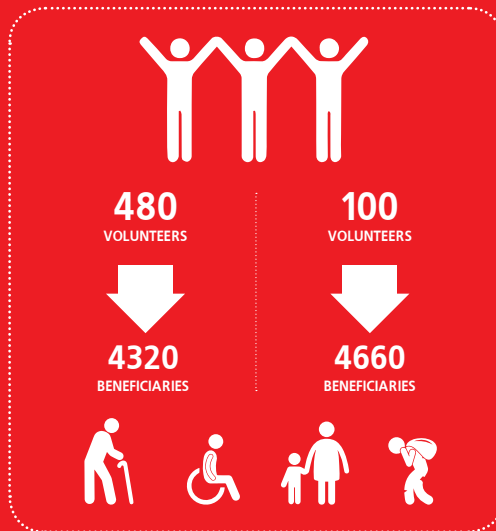




**REACHED MORE THAN 9000
BENEFICIARIES.**

Through the British Red Cross funded “Providing social care service to most vulnerable people” project which was implemented in Uvurkhangai, Darkhan-Uul, Tuv, Sukhbaatar, Dundgobi, Mandal soum of Selenge, Nalaikh and Baganuur mid-level branches, **4320 beneficiaries** were reached through **480 volunteers**.

Through the project “Integration of violence prevention and response program for women, adolescent and children” supported by Australian Red Cross Society, 4660 people of 400 households were reached through 100 volunteers in 3 mid-level branches.



I'll try my best for my children to have good education

Ganchimeg.T is the single mother with 4 children aged between 0 – 15 who is the beneficiary of Mandal soum Red Cross branch in Selenge province. Before, she was renting a Ger /traditional yurt/ and used to make a living with the children's allowance from the state. Since 2016, she has been receiving food parcel, warm clothes and heating materials as well as attending the life skill trainings within the support of “Providing social care service to most vulnerable people” project. Also, she received Ger with complete insulation after becoming a beneficiary. Furthermore, Ganchimeg.T was trained and referred to work as assistant teacher at 1st kindergarten in the soum. She said that “We were living in very hard condition without insulation during the winter, my children were feeling cold and catching cold easily. Now everything is getting better. My future goal is to try my best for my children to have a good education and increase my earning”.



Thank you for enrolling my 2 grandchildren to school /Tselvelmaa.S, citizen of Darkhan-Uul province, age 86/

I am the guardian of my two grandchildren. For many years, we were homeless, had no one to take care and support us. One day, seeking support, we visited the Red Cross mid-level branch. Branch staffs welcomed us very friendly. Then, they visited our home to see our living condition and we received Ger shortly. Also, they supported my children to enroll in high school, provided stationary and warm clothes. As well as, they provided food parcel and heating material every month. I appreciate Red Cross Youth members who come to our home to help with our chores. I'm really grateful for Red Cross enrolling my grandchildren to school and becoming our friends.

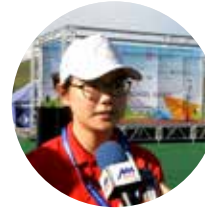

**THE INTERNATIONAL TRAININGS
WERE CONDUCTED.**



“Restoring family link in emergencies” workshop was organized at MRCS Youth training center. Participants came from South Korea, People’s Republic of China, DPRK, Japan, Mongolia and Nepal.

25 delegates from 6 countries participated.

Asia Pacific regional Practical Emergency Cash Training /PECT/ was organized at Mongolian Red Cross Youth training center. 35 delegates from 11 National Societies and IFRC staff participated.

It is my 5th year working at the Korean National Red Cross. I work in charge of cooperation between South and North Korea. I’m attending this workshop to learn the experience of other countries in restoring family links. I’ll reflect the experience I learned from here in my country.

Korean National Red Cross organizes activities to restore family links between South and North Korea. We share the information about separated families during the war to the public through Government website and send a copy to DPRK Red Cross. Once the information is reviewed and it is confirmed that the people are family, we organize family reunification meeting.

Last year, more than 800 families were reunited.

Nowadays, international humanitarian organizations and national societies are saying that providing cash assistance to beneficiaries affected by disaster is the most optimal and effective way. The training goal is to focus on sharing best practice and lessons learnt during the cash intervention in each country in order to organize more effective intervention in the future. Personally, my first experience with cash was in 2004 in Sri Lanka, after the Tsunami. Since then, I’ve participated in cash intervention in Nepal, Bangladesh, Myanmar and Burundi.

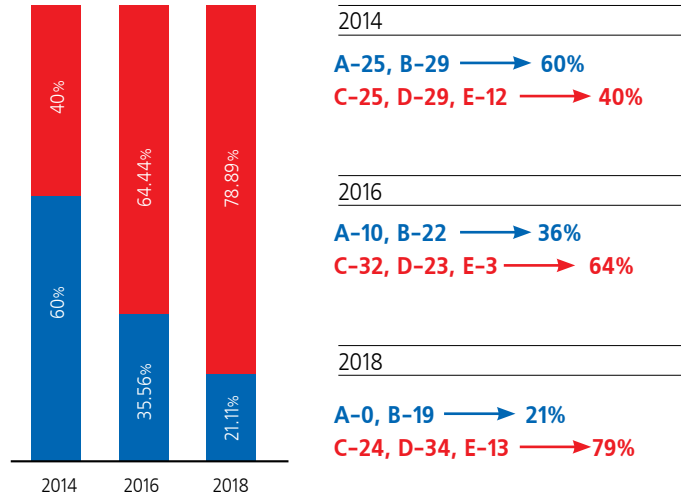




ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY IS STRENGTHENED

The 2nd review of the Organizational Capacity Assessment and Certification was conducted. 79 percent of 94 indicators reached benchmark and 21 percent of the indicators were below benchmark. Within 2 years, 47 indicators moved up and the organizational capacity was improved by 15 percent. Mongolian Red Cross Society became the 7th National Society which conducted OCAC assessment 3 times. MRCS is preparing for the peer review and certification process.

COMPARISON OF 2016/2018 OCAC EVALUATION



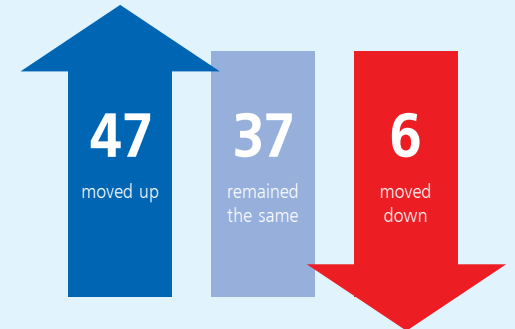
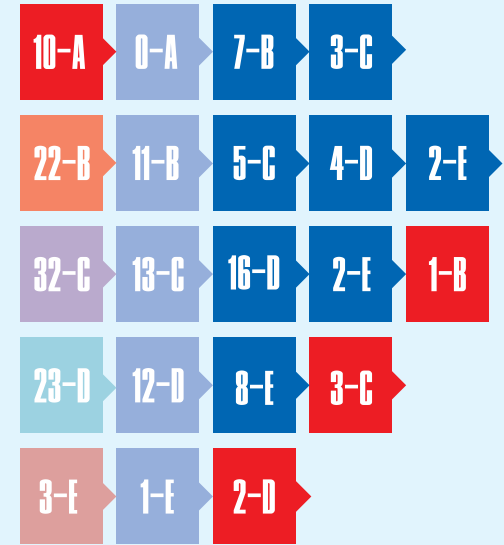

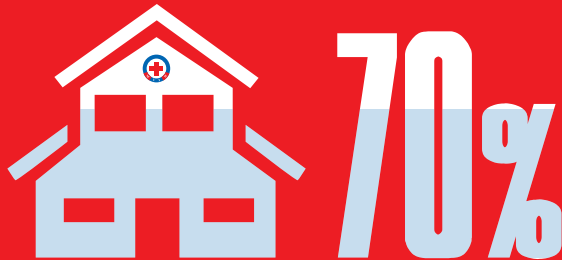


RESOURCE MOBILIZATION STRATEGY AND PUBLIC RELATION PLAN WERE UPDATED.

With the support of British Red Cross, “Public perception of Humanitarian organizations in Mongolia” reputational survey was conducted to develop Resource mobilization strategy, develop Public relation and reputational risk management plan. “MMCG” LLC was selected to conduct the research and study among 1500 people in 7 soums of 7 provinces and 6 districts for a period of 2 months. Based on the result, The Resource mobilization strategy and The Public relation plan were updated.



WORKING CONDITION



The progress of the construction work for Headquarter extension building /First aid and Rehabilitation center/ is 70%.

The training hall with the capacity of 100 people and electric power substation were constructed at the MRCS Youth training center.

In 2018, **354.4** million MNT was invested to MRCS Youth training center and income of **797.8** million MNT was generated.

With the support of IFRC, ICRC, Australian, British and Japanese Red Cross financial support of **521.9** million MNT, 5 mid-level branches and 28 primary level branches improved their capacity and enhanced their resource mobilization activities.

Bulgan and Songinokhairkhan Red Cross mid-level branches moved to new office building. Darkhan-Uul, Dundgobi, Uvurkhangai mid-level branches constructed new building for social care centers.





BEST HUMANITARIANS WERE RECOGNIZED.

“MRCS Open Door Day” event was organized on the occasion of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent day and Mongolian Humanitarian day. Mrs. Saranchuluun.O who is the founder of “Achilles International Mongolia” NGO, actress Mrs. Undarmaa.G who is the founder of “The chamber of Belief”, senior sergeant Mr. Delgersaikhan.P, the officer of National Emergency Management Agency and Golden blood donor Mr. Dashnyam.D were awarded as “Best Humanitarian worker”.

It is great to work with my peers together as a team for emergency management. As a team, we saved more than 100 people’s lives and more than 300 households from fire hazard. Not only we are mobilized for extreme winter /dzud/, but also carry out search and rescue operation during extreme weather events. STATE-RED CROSS COOPERATION WAS ACTIVATED.

The National Council for State-Red Cross Cooperation was established according to the Law on the legal status of the Mongolian Red Cross Society and the resolution of the Government of Mongolia. In 2018, State-Red Cross Cooperation was activated at all levels. MRCS received financial support of 667.5 million MNT from state and local budget to fulfill its auxiliary role to the Government of Mongolia.



THE PARTNERSHIP MEETING OF MRCS WAS ORGANIZED AND THE COOPERATION WAS BROADENED

The goal of the Partnership meeting was to discuss about the change in the socioeconomic environment of Mongolia, challenges and lessons learnt of MRCS and operational plan for the coming 2 years.

The marketplaces of 4 core programmes, organizational development and resource mobilization were organized to introduce the plan for the upcoming 2 years and the budget gap. New partnership possibilities were explored.



PARTICIPATED IN THE 10TH ASIA PACIFIC REGIONAL MEETING

The 10th Asia Pacific Regional Meeting organized by IFRC was held in Manila, Philippines. Madame Bolormaa.N the Secretary General of MRCS, led the session of “1 billion coalition” and conducted bilateral /face-to-face/ meetings with National Societies of Australia, British, Finland, Italy, Japan, Kuwait, South Korea and People’s Republic of China to expand cooperation framework.

MRCS ACHIEVED THE OBJECTIVES OF 2018 AND REACHED THE RESULTS BELOW:

1. The disaster response capacity of the National society was strengthened and 6405 households affected by dzud and flood received humanitarian assistance worth of 2.3 billion Mongolian tugriks.
2. In order to improve community resilience, "Be ready" training module was developed in cooperation with the National Emergency Management Agency and "World vision". With the module, national trainers organized 49 trainings and trained 12,013 people.
3. The quality and accessibility of community based public health promotion program was improved and simulated based first aid training content and method was used to prepare first aid trainers.
4. Community based approach to reduce social vulnerability and volunteer mobilization to reach out to target population approach was developed at mid-level branches.
5. Project for violence prevention was implemented in Bayanzurkh, Sukhbaatar and Songinokhairkhan districts and new skills are acquired at the National Society.
6. The participation of children, youth and volunteers in humanitarian activities was improved.
7. In 2018, MRCS was selected as coordinator of the Network of Mongolian volunteer organizations. MRCS took active role in developing the Law on Volunteers and expand the cooperation among the network organizations.
8. State-Red Cross Cooperation was improved at all levels and the organizational capacity was improved by 15 percent according to the Organizational Capacity Assessment and Certification by IFRC. The 79 percent of 94 indicators reached benchmark.
9. Open, transparent, responsible and multilateral partnership. The Partnership meeting of MRCS was organized. The review of program implementation from 2016-2018 and operational plan for 2019-2020 was discussed during the meeting.
