Cooperation



➤ On May 2, 2016, the Government Resolution No. 234 **"ON SOME MEASURES TO IMPLEMENT LAW"** was approved and an agreement that allocated some of the humanitarian functions of the Government of Mongolia to the Mongolian Red Cross Society was signed. After reviewing the performance of the agreement the Deputy Prime Minister U.Enkhvuvshin and President of the Mongolian Red Cross Society N.Enkhbold renewed the agreement on May 15, 2020.



➤ The working group approved by the Deputy Prime Minister's Order no. 89 organized a capacity building workshop to strengthen Local Emergency **Incident Management System** Teams in several provinces, which MRCS was the working group member.



- **JACQUES PELLET**, Personal Envoy of the President of the ICRC and Head of the Regional Delegation for East Asia visited Mongolian Red Cross Society and signed the ICRC MRCS Cooperation agreement for 2020.

➤ “COVID-19 Pandemic Response and Cooperation”

simulation exercise was organized in May, 2020 and volunteers and staffs from Red Cross mid-level branches in 9 districts and 21 provinces, actively participated. A total number of **510 people** including the volunteers and members of the Branch disaster response teams were involved.



- Under the **“LITTLE HEART”** project, **40 children** with congenital heart disease went through surgery and got successfully treated with the support of the **“Energy Resource”** company and the support of hospitals located in the Wuxi city of Shanghai district of the People Republic of China and Hohhot of Inner Mongolia.

Cooperation

➔ “Seoul medical service foundation” signed a cooperation agreement with the Mongolian Red Cross Society to support the prevention and response to the coronavirus pandemic.

Within the framework of cooperation, the **“Medical service foundation”** donated 10,000 pieces of tester that are worth **\$80,000**, and the dental x-ray apparatus worth **\$30,000** to the Mongolian Red Cross Society. MRCS donated these items to the Ministry of Health and the State Dental Center.



➔

The Red Cross Society of China's branch in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region donated a newly equipped **“Negative pressure ambulance”** that is worth of **177,570,000 MNT** to be used to transport patient with COVID-19. The Mongolian Red Cross Society handed the ambulance carto the Capital City's Ambulance center.

Initiated by E.Uuganbayar, Head of the Mongolian Red Cross Youth Movement and with the cooperation of the Mongol HD TV, Khan Bank and VEP Production, a charity tele-concert on Independence day **“MONGOLIANS AT HOME”** was organized with the purpose of supporting the target groups at risk of malnutrition during the strict lockdown. During the fundraising concert, **334 million MNT** was raised to purchase 5,572 food parcels. Within the framework of this donation, a total of 25427 individuals of 5597 households in 9 districts and 21 provinces received the support.

Cooperation

➔ Through “**Forecast based financing**” project supported by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, humanitarian assistance worth **637 million MNT was provided to 1,000 households 61 soums of 8 provinces** based on the “Dzud Risk Map”. Within the framework of the assistance, one household was provided with a unconditional cash grant of 240,000 MNT and animal care kit worth of 125,000 MNT.



In the winter of **2019-2020, 1,750 households located in 85 soums of 15 provinces** that suffered from dzud were provided with humanitarian assistance worth **966 million MNT** with the support of the Disaster Response Emergency Fund (DREF).



➤ The Mongolian Red Cross Society has signed an additional cooperation agreement with the Red Cross Society of China's branch in Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region. L.Sayanaa, Chief of Staff of the Deputy Prime Minister's Office, Sh.Ankhmaa, Deputy Minister of Health, T.Battsetseg, Director of the Neighboring Countries Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and B.Battsetseg, Vice President of the Mongolian Red Cross Society participated in the online meeting.



➤ Mr Tapan Mishra, UN Resident coordinator and Mr Sergey Diorditsa, WHO representative visited “**Volunteering in public health emergencies**” training of 600 volunteers, organized at MRCS' Youth development center.



Cooperation

➤ **Tsai Wenrui**, Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Mongolia visited the Mongolian Red Cross Society's Youth Development Center and got acquainted with its activities.



➤ Within the framework of implementing the Mongolian Disaster Protection Law, a meeting of the National Emergency Management Agency and the Mongolian Red Cross Society was held to review the implementation of the "Cooperation plan for 2015-2020", set the direction of cooperation for 2021-2025, and signed a Memorandum of Understanding. The Chiefs of the Local Emergency Management Agencies and the Secretaries of the Red Cross Mid-Level branches also signed cooperation agreement.



➤ In commemoration of the International Day of the Red Cross, Red Crescent Movement, and the Mongolian Humanitarian Day, campaign under the motto **“APPLAUSE AND THANK YOU”** was held and prepared a short video and poster to express gratitude to the Government of Mongolia, the State Emergency Commission, the Health Sector and all other organizations and citizens that are working to prevent and repress the coronavirus pandemic.



➤ In collaboration with the Ministry of Health, meeting between heads of the local Health departments and Secretaries of the Red Cross Mid-Level Branches in 9 districts and 21 provinces was organized to identify the future area of collaboration.



➤ **“National Disaster Response Team”** training was organized and topics such as “Disaster Response”, “International Humanitarian Law”, “Protection, Gender and Inclusion” “Psychological Support”, and the “WASH”. A total of **17 members** participated in the training.



Cooperation

- The National Summer Camp of the Children and Youth Movement was successfully organized under the theme **“Child and Youth Participation in time of Pandemic”** and involved more than 60 participants from 21 provinces and 9 districts.



- The Mongolian Red Cross Society's **“Volunteer Center”** was established and an introductory training was organized for a total of **14,562 volunteers**. The trained volunteers organized household visits of the target group, and provided information on how to prevent from coronavirus, and provided food assistance to vulnerable people.

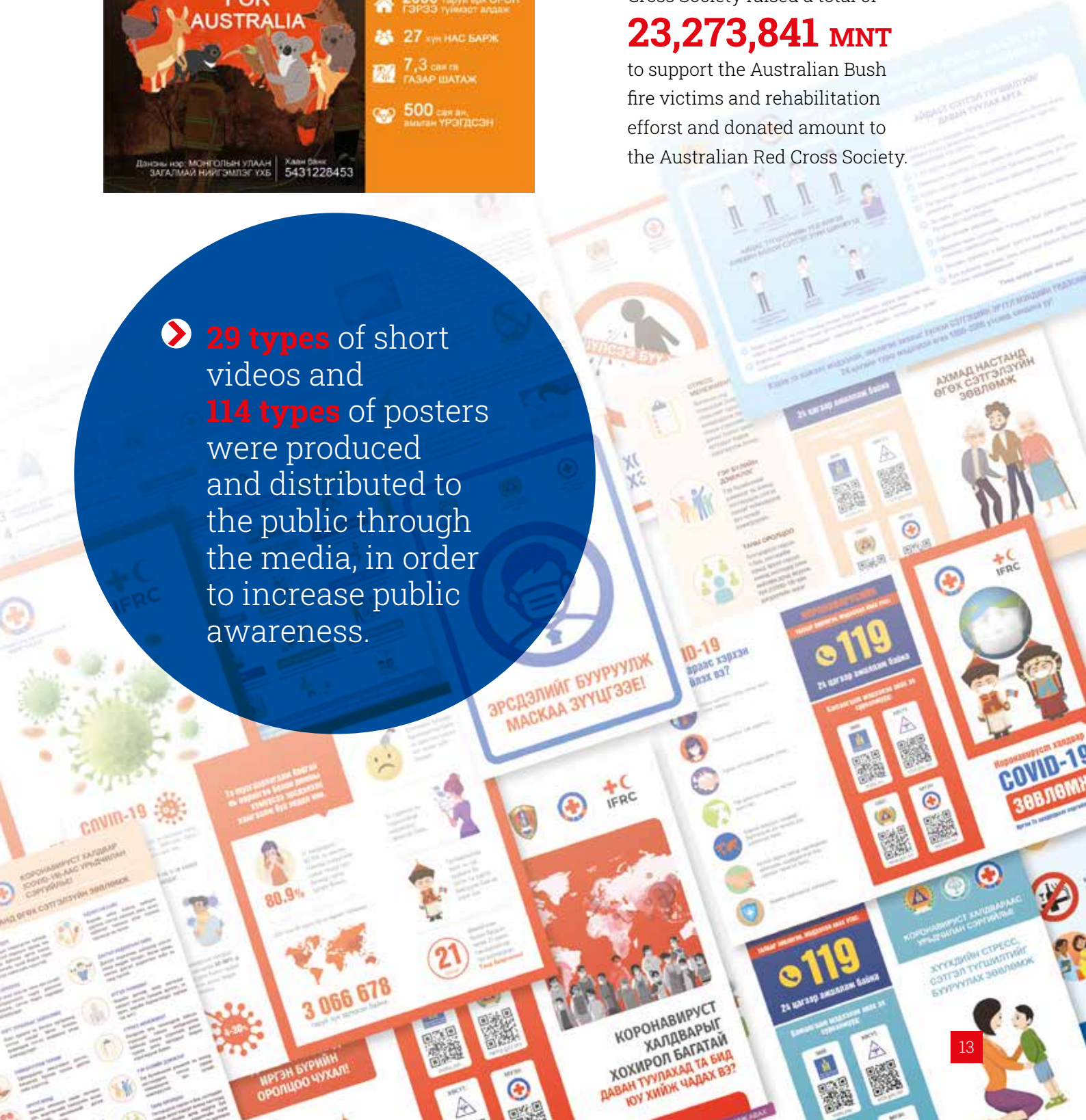
- Within the cooperation agreement between Mongolian Red Cross Society and the General Agency for Border Protection, **“Women in Border protection”** workshop was organized for the “Menen detachment unit” was organized and covered topics such as prevention of coronavirus, first aid, family values, and child development.





➤ Donation campaign was organized and the Mongolian Red Cross Society raised a total of **23,273,841 MNT** to support the Australian Bush fire victims and rehabilitation effort and donated amount to the Australian Red Cross Society.

➤ **29 types** of short videos and **114 types** of posters were produced and distributed to the public through the media, in order to increase public awareness.

Support the capacity building of Primary and Mid-level branch



- To support the development of Mid-level and Primary-level branches, “Branch Organizational Capacity Assessment” (BOCA) was organized in 28 mid-level branches, and evaluation based recommendations were developed and submitted to all mid-level branches.

➤ A total of 300 elders, caregivers, and staffs were participated in the workshop on “ Covid-19 influenza preparedness” and provided with knowledge on first-aid and psychosocial support at the National Nursing Home in Batsumber soum, Tuv Province.



➤ Mid-level branches of Bayangol and Khan-Uul districts organized event named **“Respect for the Elderly”** and total of 200 elderly people and youth volunteers participated. The purpose of the event was to honor the elders, listen to the elders, share experiences and inherit the traditions.

Support the capacity building of Primary and Mid-level branch



➤ “Nursing and care for bedridden people”

training has been organized for the volunteers and staffs of the mid-level branches and a total of **180 people** participated in the training.





➤ “Be Ready”

Training of Trainers (ToT) was organized and a total of **68 mid-level branch** volunteers have participated in the training.

➤ Within the framework of the Global Foundation's “**Active Tuberculosis Screening and Treatment Control among vulnerable people**” project, total of 3 tuberculosis examinations were conducted, **712 homeless** and vulnerable people have been covered, and **16 tuberculosis** cases were detected and receiving treatment by the National Center of Communicable Diseases.



Development of multilateral cooperation



➤ For the development of multilateral cooperation:

1000 households who were affected by the flash flooding that occurred between July and September, were provided with relief items such as unconditional cash grants, kitchen set and hygiene kit through “**Disaster Response Emergency Fund**” supported by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies.

➤ “COVID-19 – National Society’s Response”

program has been implemented with the support of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies which assisted 3000 vulnerable families with food parcels and 2500 families with hygiene parcels as well as built hand-washing stations at one hundred locations and organized public awareness campaign.



➤ “Protection, Gender and Inclusion”

training has been organized at the Youth Development Center with the support of the International Federation of Red Cross, Red Crescent Societies and the Australian Red Cross. A total of 120 people participated in the training.

➤ “Psychosocial support in emergencies”

workshop was organized together with the City Governor’s office, the International organization for Migration and the Asia foundation. A total of 92 social workers of the 9 districts participated.



Development of multilateral cooperation

➤ Within the framework of a project "Carrying out training sessions on psychosocial assistance to vulnerable groups and empowering NGOs to deliver psychosocial assistance to internal migrants", **500 manuals and 8500 brochures on "Psychosocial support in emergencies"** were published and distributed to the public.



➤ A project funded by the UNICEF and U.S Agency for International Development (USAID) has provided 3000 pieces of antibacterial liquid hand soaps, 6000 pieces of hand sanitizers and 1150 kg of javelion to 67 isolation centers in 21 provinces and 9 districts.

“Fresh Air- A Healthy Smile” 1000 children’s snow festival has been successfully organized with the cooperation of **“Skye Resort Ski Complex”**. A total of 750 children in families with low income and 250 children in orphanages from 8 districts spent a whole day in the fresh air with joy and happiness.

Finance and logistics



- Special attention was paid to making the financial activities of the Mongolian Red Cross Society transparent and MOORE-International Audit organization conducted an audit of the financial activities of the year 2019.

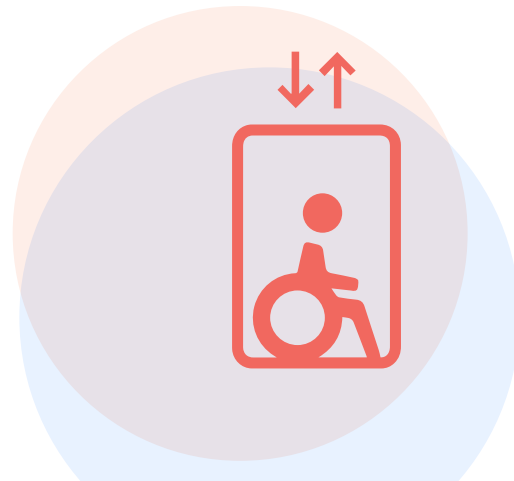


- In cooperation with the “**Bichil Globus**” financial group, the “**Humanitarian classroom**” was established at the special school no.29 of the Ulaanbaatar city and handed over to the school administration on the occasion of the new school year.



- **100,000 pieces of single-use face masks and 25,000 pieces of N95 face masks** were donated by the Red Cross Society of China and the Inner Mongolian Red Cross branch. Mongolian Red Cross Society handed over the **25,000 pieces of N95 face masks** to Ministry of Health and the National Center for Communicable Diseases.

➤ In 2020, Mongolian Red Cross Society’s Headquarter raised **185,8 million** tugrugs for the construction of an elevator at the “First Aid Training and Rehabilitation center” to serve people with disabilities.



As part of the Mongolian Red Cross Society’s COVID-19 response activities and ensuring transparency all donations and assistance reports and humanitarian activities were reported to the public.

Accounting and reporting skills of Red Cross Mid-level branch Secretaries and accountants have been improved.

Through “Social care center” activities of the mid-level branches , total of **13520 elderly**, disabled people, single parents and vulnerable people were reached with psychosocial support, psychological first-aid and humanitarian education.

Mongolian Red Cross Society has achieved appropriate results in improving the Legal status of the Mongolian Red Cross Society, strengthening State and Red Cross cooperation, expanding the range of Red Cross members and trained volunteers, building human resource capacity, developing responsible partnerships, and ensuring transparency of openness.



Mongolian Red Cross Youth Movement initiated “**TikTok Video Contest**” to encourage the public to prevent the spread of Covid-19, winners were announced and rewarded.



MNT 638.4 million was provided for **COVID-19** pandemic prevention and preparedness.





Food parcels were distributed to

18,421

vulnerable households during all-out readiness/full lockdown due to COVID-19.



In cooperation with the Korean Open Doctors Society, vulnerable groups of Khentii province, Khan-Uul and Bagakhangai districts were provided with free medical screening. A total of **4600 people** was examined.

The capacity of the National Society is being strengthened at all levels, and the capacity of all mid-level branches is being steadily improved. The Mongolian Red Cross Society has successfully organized a nationwide campaign to assist the Mongolian Government in preventing, quarantining, restricting, and responding to the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic.
