On behalf of the Mongolian Red Cross Society, I extend my heartfelt greetings to each of you.

The year 2024 has been truly remarkable for the Mongolian Red Cross Society, filled with significant achievements and memorable events.

It has also been a year of learning for all of us, as members of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. This year reminded us that addressing global humanitarian challenges requires continuous effort, innovation, the application of new techniques, and, most importantly, steadfast adherence to our Fundamental principles of humanity and impartiality.

During the harsh winter of 2023-2024, approximately 90% of Mongolia's territory was blanketed in snow, resulting in Dzud conditions across 251 soums in 21 provinces and 4 districts of the capital city. This disaster severely impacted 186,000 herder households, leading the Government to declare a state of heightened readiness.



# GOALS SET FOR 2024

The Mongolian Red Cross Society has set the following goals and objectives for 2024

## Goal:

Within the framework of the mission of the Mongolian Red Cross Society, the 2030 Strategy will be implemented to strengthen the capacity of the National Society at all levels.

## Objectives:

- Expand multi-sectoral cooperation, enhance the National Society's capacity for disaster preparedness and response, and effectively organize needs-based humanitarian assistance.
- Implement community-based public health promotion activities and strengthen the capacity to respond during emergencies.
- Carry out activities aimed at improving the livelihood of communities and reducing vulnerabilities, with the support and participation of the community at all levels.
- Expand our membership base, humanitarian member organizations, volunteer groups, community groups, and youth movements while enhancing the Primary and Middle Level Branch capacity.
- Develop organizational culture and humanitarian diplomacy, introduce innovative practices in digital information technology, and ensure the transparency and openness of the National Society.
- Improve the financial management of the National Society at all levels, increase revenue, and expand activities in the area of resource mobilizations.

## OUR ACTIVITIES

# Climate change and disaster management program

During the severe winter of **2023-2024**, approximately **186,000** herder households from **17** provinces and **251** soums were affected by the Dzud disaster. In response, the Mongolian Red Cross Society, with support from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, issued an international appeal, provided humanitarian aid to affected herders, implemented disaster response measures and successfully fulfilled our auxiliary role to the Government.



Humanitarian aid worth **8.9 billion** MNT, including cash, animal-care kits, food parcels, hygiene kits and psychosocial support were provided to **12,130** herder households in 21 provinces that has been affected by Dzud, snowstorms, sandstorms and flash floods.

With the support from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, **3000** households were provided with 550,000 MNT per household, amounting to a total of **3.6 billion** MNT in cash, along with animal-care kits and psychosocial support.



Through USAID (United States Agency for International Development), **700** households received **567.9** million MNT in cash, animal-care kits, and psychosocial support.



The Government of the Republic of Korea provided **700** households with **675** million MNT in cash, animal-care kits, and psychosocial support



**600** households received **457.2** million MNT in cash, animal-care kits, and psychosocial support through the support of the Government of Australia via the Red Cross.



**1,850** households received **1.6** billion MNT in cash, animal-care kits, and psychosocial support through European Union Humanitarian Aid.



**700** herder households received **537.6** million MNT in cash and hygiene kits through the support of the Government of Serbia.



**700** households received dignity kits through the support of UNFPA (United Nations Population Fund).



**1,500** herder households received **303.3** million MNT in food packages and warm clothing through the Red Cross Society of China.



**500** households received **110.4 million** MNT in food and animal-care kits through the support of the Embassy of the People's Republic of the China in Mongolia.



**500** households received **200** million MNT in cash and mineral feed packages through donations from Badrakh Energy LLC.



**100** households received **46.4** million MNT in food and mineral feed packages through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.



**380** households in **4** provinces received **341** million MNT in aid through the support of the Kuwait Red Crescent Society.



**400** herder households received food packages through cooperation with the Qatar Red Crescent Society.

The National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), the U.S. Embassy, and the Pacific Army Command jointly organized the international disaster response exercise **“Gobi Wolf-2024.”** During this event, Red Cross volunteers from Dornod province participated by providing first aid and psychosocial support.

A total of **1,216** individuals, including members of the National disaster response team, branch staffs, and volunteers, participated in training sessions.



Representatives from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies have worked at the Mongolian Red Cross Society as a surge team to support the humanitarian response program.

On the occasion of the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction, **“Be Ready”** training and first aid training were organized, reaching over **9,000** individuals across 12 provinces.



A capacity-building training program involved **173 members** of disaster response teams of Red Cross Mid-level branches in Orkhon, Darkhan-Uul, Uvs, Dornod, Khentii, and Sukhbaatar provinces.

Trainers established **22 volunteer groups** with **15** members each in **10** soums of **5** provinces and 6 districts of the capital city. These groups were trained to assist the Red Cross Mid-level branches and emergency response agencies during disasters, involving **330 volunteers** who received hands-on training.



Under a project supported by BHA, **16 volunteer** firefighting teams with 15 members each were established in soums of Bayan-Ulgii, Bayankhongor, Govi-Altai, Zavkhan, Uvurkhangai, Umnugovi, Sukhbaatar, Selenge, Tuv, Khovd, and Uvs provinces.



The teams were equipped with firefighting tools and provided training to **240** individuals in collaboration with the provincial Local Emergency Management Agency.

In collaboration with the “Mongolian National Federation of Pasture User Groups”, a training and experience-sharing sessions were held to strengthen the skills of herders. A total of **120 herders** from Umnugovi, Dundgovi, Tuv, Darkhan-Uul, and Selenge provinces participated in these sessions.



## OUR ACTIVITIES



# Public health promotion program

- With the support of the Australian Red Cross, “Community-Based Surveillance of Zoonotic Diseases” project is being implemented in the provinces of Dornod, Sukhbaatar, and Khentii. A total of **225** volunteers are actively involved in regular activities, including surveillance, prevention, and information dissemination among the public.

- In collaboration with the Inner Mongolian Red Cross branch of Red Cross Society of China, the First aid Instructors trainings were organized in Shiliinhot, Inner Mongolia, and Ulaanbaatar. A total of **100** first aid instructors have been trained.



- Within the project cooperation with UNICEF, 5 batches of training of trainers on “Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) during Flooding” organized at MRCS Youth training center and involved **150** participants from Government organizations across nine districts of Ulaanbaatar. After the ToT, those trained instructors delivered WASH in Emergencies training and information to **2,300 people**, focusing on flood preparedness and hygiene practices.



- To enhance the capacity and preparedness of First Aid Teams at Mid-level branches and equip them with skills in psychological support and the advanced level first aid during disasters, a national first aid competition was organized in collaboration with Japanese Red Cross Society and Mongolian Society of Emergency Medicine.

- A total of **95 participants** attended the competition, including team members from various sectors such as health, education, police, emergency services, and transportation, representing different provinces and districts. **248 Red Cross members** of 31 Mid-level branches including volunteers, representatives of Government and non-government organizations actively participated in the National First Aid competition.



- Two refresher training sessions for volunteers and a capacity building training for team leaders were organized, with a total of **220** volunteers participating. A manual for volunteers and team leaders have been developed and its being used in surveillance and prevention activities.



- Ten ophthalmologists from provincial and district health centers participated in the "Optical Professional Training" program, organized in collaboration with the Inner Mongolian Red Cross Branch of Red Cross Society of China.



■ **114 elderly people** received free eye cataract surgical treatment under the collaboration between MRCS, Inner Mongolian Red Cross branch of Red Cross Society of China, Chao-Ju eye group of China and Second State Central Hospital of Mongolia. This mission was held in Erlian city of Inner Mongolia, based on Mobile surgical clinic from Chao-ju eye group.



■ “Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support and Mass Casualty Incident Emergency Response” training was organized in collaboration with the Japanese Red Cross Society, the Mongolian Society of Emergency Medicine, and EMS Global. The training involved **60 participants**, including emergency medical doctors from **35 hospitals** and MRCS staff from the Health and Social protection department.

■ **271 children** with congenital heart diseases were examined and diagnosed by the joint Chinese and Mongolian specialists at Bayanzurkh Hospital of Ulaanbaatar under the project “Angel’s journey” implementing with Chinese Red Cross Foundation. A total of **75 children** are selected for the free surgical treatment opportunity. The first group, with **25 children** had surgical treatment at Anzhen hospital in Beijing, Zhenzhou Hospital in Hunan province of China in November 2024.





The Commercial first aid training sessions were organized 55 times to provide participants with the skills and practices required at the workplaces and 1,510 participants from different organizations and entities were involved.



- MRCS organized total **250 blood donation days** and provided advocacy sessions among **58,400 people** and recruited **9,500 voluntary blood donors**.

- The blood donor recruitment events were organized **44 times** hosted by 11 Youth Red Cross Clubs at the different Universities and Colleges.

- **144 blood donors** were awarded the "Honorary Blood Donor" medal by the Mongolian Red Cross Society.



The Asia-Pacific Regional Training on "Mental Health and Psychosocial Support During Disasters" and the Asia-Pacific International Conference on "Integrating Mental Health and Psychosocial Support into Regional Contexts During Disasters, Conflicts, and Prolonged Crises" were successfully organized in collaboration with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies Asia-Pacific Reference Centre for Mental Health and Psychosocial Support and Cooperation, the Japanese Red Cross Society.

Representatives from 12 National societies in the Asia-Pacific region, along with participants from the Mongolian Red Cross Society, the Ministry of Health, the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the International Organization for Migration, attended the conference.

## OUR ACTIVITIES



# Social protection and inclusion program

- Within the framework of the Law on Social Welfare of Mongolia and the Law on the Legal Status of the Mongolian Red Cross Society, **15** Red Cross Mid Level Branches signed cooperation agreements with their respective **General Department of Labor and Welfare Service**.

In 2024, **15** Mid Level Red Cross Branches implemented the “Community-based Social care” service initiative.

- In 2024, **30** Red Cross Mid-level branches organized community-wide social care and protection campaigns and reached **25,850** people through the “Social Care center”



- Within the framework of the “Graduation Pilot Program”, implementing in collaboration with the Asian Development Bank and the **Ministry of Family, Labor and Social Protection**, **1,259** target households in Songinokhairkhan, Chingeltei, and Bayanzurkh districts, received grant to start small businesses and developed new module for “from social welfare to labor” to reduce poverty.

## OUR ACTIVITIES

# Youth development program



- The “East Asian Youth Camp gathering – 2024” event was successfully organized under the theme “Youth as Future Leaders.” The program brought together **80** juniors and Red Cross Youth members from Mongolia, South Korea, China, and Japan, fostering the exchange of innovative practices implemented at the national and regional levels.



- The “**Membership Exchange Program**” designed to strengthen international friendship and cooperation was successfully implemented. A delegation from Aichi Prefecture, Japan, consisting of **11** members and **6** staff have visited Mongolia.



- The “Korea-Mongolia Member Exchange Program” was successfully organized in June 2024. The program included **29** representatives from Chungnam University’s Red Cross Youth in Republic of Korea, along with 10 members and 2 staff from the Youth development program of Mongolia, engaging a total of **45** participants.



- The “National Camp Gathering 2024” event was organized, with the participation of **280** members from 25 Mid-level branch.



- The “**Fresh Air – Healthy Smiles**” event was organized to bring joy to **1000** children, including those from target groups, orphanages, and special needs schools across nine districts. Branded products were generously provided as gifts by MCS Coca-Cola.



- In an effort to promote volunteerism among adolescents and to prevent harmful behaviors and criminal activities, three series of reels, podcast episode were published, collectively reaching **28,784** individuals with positive information.
- Through the digital platforms of the Youth development program, a series of videos promoting mental health education for children and youth, along with two videos specifically designed to engage adolescents, were published and reached a total audience of **315,286** people.

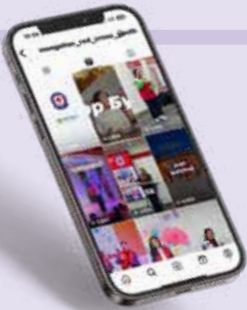
- On the occasion of World Children’s Day, the “Mongolian Child” event was jointly organized with the Arts and Culture Department of the Authority of Child and Family Development Protection of the and the **Mongolian Children’s** Palace.



- With the support of the Subcommittee on Crime Prevention and Coordination, the “**PROtect PROject**” was successfully implemented, aiming to enhance mental health education among adolescents.



- The **"Car-Free Day – 2024"** event, organized by Office of the Governor of the Capital City, was attended by **350** members from six districts of the Red Cross Youth Movement. The event featured a bicycle parade, mobile advocacy campaigns, flash mob dance performances.
- Training sessions focused on enhancing mental health education and preventing crime and violations were conducted for Secondary school students in the districts of Bayangol, Bayanzurkh, Songinokhairkhan, Sukhbaatar, and Chingeltei. Directly engaged 300 students and indirectly reached a total of **900** students.



A total of **99** short videos and reels promoting various activities were published on the Youth Development Program's Instagram page, alongside **277** posters shared on their Facebook page. Aimed to raise awareness about the movement, prevent juvenile crime, and educate the public on child protection laws, reaching **4,212,721** people.

- During various commemorative days, **14,826** people were directly involved in activities, and **167,202** people were reached through social media platforms.





# VOLUNTEER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

- The Volunteer Policy of the Mongolian Red Cross Society was updated and approved by the Governing Board subsequently disseminated to Mid-level branch managers, staffs, and volunteers, reaching a total of **360** individuals.



- A comprehensive training module covering safety, security, gender equality, participation, child protection, and the implementation of the Volunteer Policy was developed and delivered via online training to **300** volunteers from Mid-level branches.



- A National Forum was successfully organized to strengthen and expand the network of volunteers within the Mongolian Red Cross Society.



- The first day of each month was designated as "Volunteer Appreciation Day" to honor the efforts and contributions of volunteers.
- Organized the **"Thank You to Our Volunteers"** event, in November and December, recognized and expressed gratitude to **110** active volunteers for their dedication and service.



# THE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The Youth development center maintained an uninterrupted operation throughout the year, successfully organizing a total of **26** training and workshop sessions with an attendance of **1,029** individuals.

The Youth development center hosted **3** International events from the Asia-Pacific region and East Asia, introducing foreign guests and representatives to Mongolian customs and traditions.

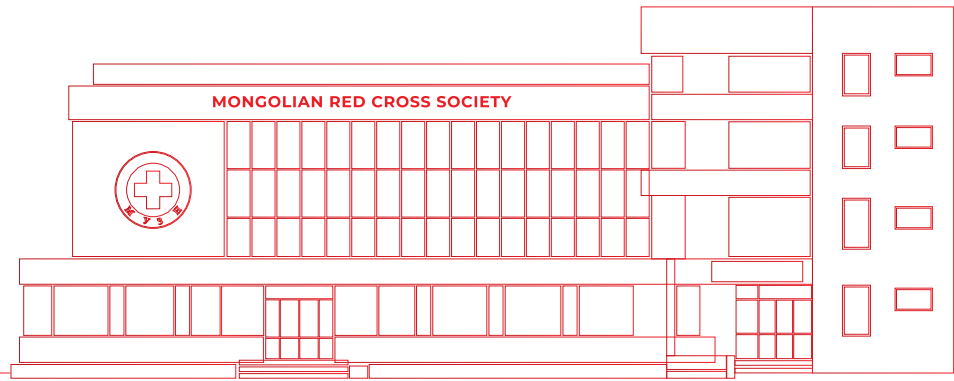

## ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Mongolian Red Cross Society, in collaboration with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, successfully organized the “East Asia Five Plus Leaders’ Forum” in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.



World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day, along with the Mongolian Humanitarian Day, were celebrated across the country under the slogan of **“Keep Humanity Alive”**.

Organized an event to celebrate the 85th anniversary of the Mongolian Red Cross Society, emphasizing its humanitarian achievements, reflecting on lessons learned from the past, and showcasing the significant historical role played by the National Society.





“Third Festival of Arts and Sports” for Red Crossers was held in Dalanzadgad City of Umnugobi Province as part of the 85th Anniversary Festivities of the Mongolian Red Cross Society.

The Mongolian Red Cross Society, in collaboration with the International Committee of the Red Cross, has organized the “Southeast, Northeast Asia and the Pacific Advanced Session on International Humanitarian Law”, the “International Humanitarian Law Moot Competition”, the “International Humanitarian Law Training for Legal Advisers of the Armed Forces”, and participated in the “Khan Quest 2024” Peace-support Operations Training as part of its initiative to promote and disseminate international humanitarian law.



These activities have reached **28** government representatives from **10** different countries, **240** armed forces members, legal advisers, and **100** students in total.

Partnerships and cooperation have been strengthened and expanded with a diverse range of key stakeholders, including the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the International Committee of the Red Cross, United Nations agencies, as well as Red Cross and Red Crescent National Societies from countries such as Australia, China, France, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Qatar, Kuwait, U.S. Agency for International Development, European Union, the Australian Embassy in Ulaanbaatar, Embassy of the People’s Republic of China in Mongolia, World Health Organization, Asian Developmental Bank, and other governmental, non-governmental, and international organizations.



# SUPPORT OF THE MID-LEVEL BRANCH DEVELOPMENT

- Collaboration between the Government and the Red Cross improved at both national and local levels, enabling the Mongolian Red Cross Society to actively fulfill its mandate of assisting the Government in humanitarian efforts.



- Within the framework of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Mongolian Red Cross Society and the National Emergency Management Agency, the implementation of joint efforts from 2021 to 2024 was reviewed, highlighting key achievements and areas of progress. The direction for continued collaboration over the next four years was outlined, culminating in the signing of a new memorandum. Chief of the Local Emergency Management Agency's at Provincial and District level signed a cooperation agreement for the years 2025-2028 with the Mid-level Branch Managers of the Mongolian Red Cross Society.

- In honor of the 85th Anniversary Festivities and the International Day for Older Persons, "Memory Meeting" was held to express gratitude towards senior staffs.



- By the decree of the President of Mongolia, **128** employees, volunteers, and members of the Mongolian Red Cross Society were honored with state awards and medals in recognition of their active contributions to humanitarian work.

- Promotion of the Seven Fundamental Principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, International Humanitarian Law, emblem regulations, and the Law on the Legal Status of the Mongolian Red Cross Society organized, reaching

■ In 2024, **1,411** individuals joined the Mongolian Red Cross Society as volunteers, bringing the total number of active volunteers to **3,490**, all contributing to various humanitarian activities

■ In the area of supporting the development of children and youth, international and national camp gatherings were organized, engaging **360** children and youth members of the Red Cross.

■ The Sustainable Development Indicators for Primary-Level Branches were revised in 2024, with **12** training sessions and other activities being held to provide skills and experience to **348** members and volunteers, strengthening the capacity of Primary-Level Branches.



In 2024, **8,148** individuals joined the Mongolian Red Cross Society as members and are actively participating in humanitarian activities.

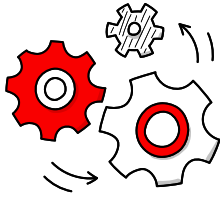

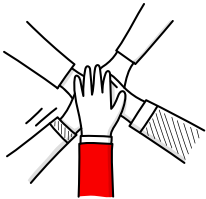

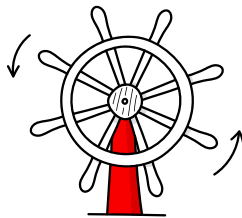

In 2024, MRCS conducted a **BOCA** assessment to evaluate the capacity of its Mid-level branches using the updated methodology from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. This assessment helped pinpoint the strengths and challenges of **9** Mid-level branches, and workplan was produced to address gaps.



A total of **130** staff members and active volunteers from **31** mid-level branches participated in training sessions, experience-sharing meetings, and events organized by the MRCS Headquarter. These activities contributed to the enhancement of their knowledge, skills, and practical experience.



MRCS Headquarters received **175.2 million** MNT from the National budget in 2024 as part of collaborative efforts, while **28** Mid-level branches secured **1.3 billion MNT** from local Government budgets. These funds were utilized for disaster preparedness and emergency response, livelihood and social health support for vulnerable groups, and engaging children and youth in humanitarian activities.

## FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES



To ensure transparency and accountability in its financial operations, the Mongolian Red Cross Society underwent an audit for the fiscal year of 2023 conducted by the international auditing firm "Ernst & Young." The audit found no financial irregularities, confirming that the organization operated responsibly, free from corruption and conflicts of interest.

Notable achievements were made in enhancing financial transparency and improving the processes of budgeting, planning, and reporting through the successful update of the "Diamond Program" and the development of a comprehensive "Financial Development Plan". Additionally, the Finance department of the Headquarter has streamlined the delivery of cash assistance, ensuring direct transfers to the bank accounts of disaster-affected citizens for greater efficiency and accountability.

# RESOURCE MOBILIZATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



With the support of the Australian Red Cross, “Seed funding” project implemented in the Mid-level branches of Dornod, Darkhan-Uul, Govi-Altai, Uvs, and Umnugovi provinces, as well as in the Sukhbaatar district of the capital city, providing grant of **180 million** MNT.



The Mongolian Red Cross Society actively focused on Resource Mobilization at all levels, raising

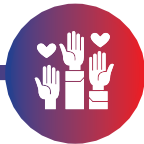

# NUMBER OF PEOPLE REACHED



A total of **76,848** individuals were reached through efforts to promote the Seven fundamental principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, its emblem, humanitarian law, and the Law on the Legal Status of the Mongolian Red Cross Society.



In 2024, the Mongolian Red Cross Society saw the enrollment of 8,148 new members and 1,411 active volunteers, bringing the total number of regularly active volunteers to **17,643**.



Two international and national camps were organized to support the development of children and youth, engaging **360** child and youth members of the Red Cross



A total of 44,500 individuals actively participated in the activities of the team supporting the development of children and youth. Additionally, 75,000 new members joined the children and youth movement, reaching a total of **119,500** individuals through direct engagement.



In the areas of disaster preparedness, prevention of disaster events, and the prevention of infectious and non-infectious diseases, as well as promoting public health, a total of 89 content pieces were produced: 31 videos, 58 images, and posters. These materials reached **1,005,590** individuals. Furthermore, 51 activity reports and updates were disseminated to the public through 24 media outlets.



**227,398** individuals were reached through efforts aimed at disaster prevention, preparedness, response during disasters, and post-disaster recovery activities.



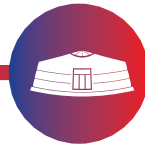
Under the Government of Mongolia's "From Welfare to Work" policy, a pilot program based on the "Graduation Approach" was implemented, lifting **1,259** vulnerable households in three districts of the capital city out of poverty.



In the framework of the public health promotion program, **40,379** individuals were directly reached.



The social care and inclusion program has directly reached **20,958** individuals.



In 2024, 30 mid-level Red Cross branches organized community-wide campaigns to support social welfare and participation, reaching **25,850** individuals through the "Welfare Home" center.



A total of **250** blood donation awareness events were held, reaching **58,400** people with information, and **9,500** voluntary, unpaid blood donors were recruited.



The Children and Youth Development Center ensured the safety and normal operations of its activities, organizing 26 training sessions and events, engaging **1,029** participants.

In 2024, the Mongolian Red Cross Society celebrated its 85th anniversary, marking a significant occasion to raise public awareness of its humanitarian achievements, lessons learned from the past, and the historical role played by the National Society. The celebration also served as an opportunity to express gratitude and respect to the elder generation, strengthen the organization's capacity, expand and develop the Red Cross movement for members, supporters, volunteers, children, and youth, and spread humanitarian work across the country. All levels of the Red Cross organization actively initiated and effectively carried out these efforts.



A total of 128 Red Cross staff members, active volunteers, and representatives of the elder Red Cross generation who made valuable contributions to humanitarian work were awarded state honors and medals by the decree of the President of Mongolia.



During the winter of 2023-2024, snow coverage extended across 90% of Mongolia's territory, with **251** soums in **21** provinces and **4** districts in the capital facing severe winter conditions and a Dzud disaster. The government declared a state of heightened disaster preparedness, and 186,000 herder households were affected by the Dzud. In this critical time, the Mongolian Red Cross Society honorably and responsibly fulfilled its duty by assisting the government in humanitarian efforts and providing additional support during the crisis.



In collaboration with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the "Emergency Appeal" was launched, providing urgent humanitarian aid worth 8.9 billion MNT to **49,000** herders across **12,130** households. This assistance helped protect the lives, health, and livelihoods of communities from the impacts of natural disasters.



The Mongolian Red Cross Society hosted the East Asia 5+ Leaders forum in Mongolia, where the leaders of the National societies agreed on several key issues. These included the implementation of the "**Hanoi Call for Action**", enhancing disaster preparedness, addressing climate change, increasing youth participation, promoting women's leadership, ensuring healthy and long life, and collaborating during potential large-scale disasters in the region. They also agreed on improving participation and transparency.
